Youth development ideas	
Icepits Wood – Entrance from A143 Develop new piece of land Woodland Management Plan Trim trail	
Footpaths/bridleways/cycle routes: Re-instating those not on the definitive map Map of walks/runs/cycle paths in the village and to adjoining villages*	
Continue to work with the trustees of the Schofield Estate, to create a community woodland	

Identifying trees/areas of trees in the village which have or may benefit from TPOs	
Interaction with businesses

Provision of a bench by the allotments	

* Footpaths – request from a resident - (i) A footpath along the side of the grassed area between Bunbury Avenue and The Park and (ii) extending the footpaths from Nacton Lane to Fornham St Martin and from the A143 (around the stud) which currently comes out on Fornham Road, to continue round to Livermere Road
